Statement in response to the New York Post

The article in the New York Post portrays our law firm, Allred Maroko and

Goldberg (AMG), in a completely false light. We have earned the respect, trust

and loyalty of more than 10,000 clients over nearly 50 years that we have been

practicing law and we have won in excess of one billion dollars for our clients. In

addition, we have won many legal precedents in courts of law which have helped

many victims even if they were not our clients.

The New York Post article accuses us of exploiting our clients and taking a

fee of 75%. This is a preposterous and false allegation. We did not get where we

are by exploiting anyone. We have achieved our success by winning victories in

courts of law and in settlements with and without lawsuits.

Our contingency fees align with those charged by other victims' rights

attorneys with similar backgrounds, education, experience, and success. At no

point in our 49 years of practice have our fees ever been 75% or anything close to

that. Furthermore, not a single client has ever alleged to us that we have charged

or would charge such a fee.

We question why *The New York Post* chose to publish an article relying on

"anonymous sources" rather than naming them. Why is a source they claim is

critical of me not identified? Transparency and credibility matter, and the absence of named sources raises important questions about *The New York Post* and the bias that it has against me as an extremely successful woman lawyer.

This appears to be yet another politically motivated attack by a right-wing tabloid publication attempting to discredit me and my law firm. The *New York Post* and *The Wall Street Journal* are both owned by NewsCorp, a major conservative corporation that is not known to be a supporter of women lawyers who fight for justice and expanded rights for women and minorities, as I have done throughout my entire professional career. These publications have shown little support for those who fight for justice on behalf of those who have been denied it.

Their attempts to misrepresent us will not succeed. We will not be deterred by their efforts to cast us in a false and negative light. Our commitment to seeking justice for our clients will continue as will our record of success on behalf of our clients both in settlements and courts of law.
